 - a. Treasurer's Report: 04/02/19
 - Currently in the bank as of 04/02/19 the Band Boosters have \$7,130.77 with \$8,076.00 in the CD for replacement of the entire marching band tower.
 - There are pending deposits of \$1,918.50
 - **However**, there are outstanding invoice payments in the amount of \$297.30 which include concert season instructional staff and misc. bills.
 - So realistically, we have \$8,751.97 at the moment.

As of 04/02/19: **\$16,046.23** is still owed to the Band Program through the Band Boosters.

Money owed to the Band Boosters down \$1,854.62 from last month.

Students that still owe band fees broken down by class:

- 16 Seniors
- 10 Juniors
- 20 Sophomores
- 15 Freshmen

Physical copies of statements given to students 04/01/19 Emails sent to parents and students 04/0219.

We must continue to push the collection of band fees.

b. Fundraising: Below is a listing of student profit from the following fund raisers:
19 students participated in the Yankee Candle Raiser and the profit was \$1,091.00.
6 student and 1 staff participated in the Poinsettia Fund Raiser and the profit was \$143.55.
11 students and 1 board member participated in the Citrus Fund Raiser and the profit was \$622.90.

Total revenue from the last 3 fund raisers \$1,855.45.

17 student signed-up for the Rock-a-thon. I believe 17 students participated in the Rock-a-thon. \$1261.00 has been turned in from Rock-a-thon from 6 students. An additional \$80 in tips was turned in as well.

The Marching Lions Color Guard raised \$514.95 during their summer fundraisers. That money has been divided equally between the 10 students named as participants by the instructor in charge, Stephanie Saunders and worked out to \$51.50 per student.

c. Uniform Committee:

- Currently, all concert attire should be organized and hanging on the racks in the booster storage closet.
- Next concert will be the joint concert with the Swiss Central Army Band, 4/23/19.
- Sample for new bibbers should arrive sometime in April.
- Following concerts scheduled: Spring Coffee house 5/9, 7:00pm, Spring Bands Concert, 5/23, 7:00pm.
- Uniform for Wind Ensemble and Jazz Band need to be ready by 4/23/19
- Uniform for Jazz Assessment needs to be prepared by 5/2/19

d. Hospitality:

- Always looking for donations of granola bars and water.
- District Assessment sold concessions. Thank you to all of the boosters who came in and volunteered a couple of hours to make the even run smoothly.

IV. Old Business

- a. Travel: The administrative team announced that there will be no approved field trips from April 9 June 15. It has been decided to move the collections of Marching Band fees back into the previous school year to try and spread out the payments so that the band students/families can possibly afford a trip earlier in the year 2020.
- b. Both the Symphonic Band and the Wind Ensemble earned all superior ratings at the VBODA State Concert Band Assessment Adjudication. Out of a possible 28 categories, each band received 26 A's and 2 B's. With the well-deserved earned ratings, Tallwood has been selected as a VA Honor Band for the 11th time in a row and 14th time in school history. As always, thank you for supporting the Tallwood Band Program.
- c. The first draft of a completed new marching band uniform should be here within the next 30 days from the G2 Performance. We look forward to working through the process for an upgraded look for the fall.
- d. A major thanks goes out to Rebecca Edwards for soliciting a grant of \$4,519.00 from the American Borate Company for their amazing donation toward a new marching band trailer. We are going to begin the process for donations to sponsor the marching band, having their logo on the back of the trailer. In addition, this amount of money is only about 2/3 of the cost of what is needed for the band program. All locks and labor will also be donated for the safety of the trailer.
